Ecosystems: Interactions, Energy & Dynamics:

Bring a bag of seeds into the classroom in order and share the different areas that are best for them to grow. Then share about where they won't grow. What about on top of DeSoto Caverns, or what about inside?

Ecosystems: Point 2

Utilize studying the different habitats of this state that your students would encounter, what animals survive and which don't. Has anyone been to the beach? What lives there? Has anyone been to DeSoto Caverns? What sort of animals would live there?

Native American History

Native Americans used our Caverns as a shelter. The following are significant

Hernando DeSoto

Hernando was was a Spanish explorer and conquistador and was the first European to view this cave's majestic beauty.

I.W. Wright

The earliest Cave grafiti in the US was carved by I.W. Wright, a fur trader at DeSoto Caverns in 1723.

Benjamin Hawkins

George Washington's primary Indian agent was invited on a special tour of DeSoto Caverns by the Creek Indians.

This tour led to DeSoto Caverns becoming the first cave on record in the United States!

Civil War

DeSoto Caverns has an original trench dug during the Civil War for mining gun powder in the Caverns.

Ida Mathis

Ida Mathis purchased the Caverns in 1910 to mine it for its gem stone quality onyx. Ida Mathis is in the Women's Hall of Fame for her work as the "Leader of Alabama's agricultural Renaissance" and the "economic Moses of the South." Her efforts have been estimated to be worth \$20 million to her home state back in the early 1900s. The Caverns are still privately owned and run by her descendents today.

The Prohibition

The Cavern Tavern was a short lived installation by Pete Willie, aka Old Popcorn. This Speakeasy served moonshine during the Prohibition in the 1920s.
